

WARSON WOODS STREET TREE LIST

THIS IS A LISTING OF TREE TYPES THAT DO WELL IN THIS AREA

Small-Sized Trees to 20-35' in urban areas

- Japanese Tree Lilac *Leafs out early, blooms late Spring, hardy tree*
Eastern Redbud *Grows fast, protect from string trimmers*
'Merrill' Magnolia *Grows faster than star or saucer magnolia types. Use single trunk form for street tree locations.*
'Winter King' Green Hawthorne *White flowers, red berries, some thorns*
Trident Maple *Pretty bark, tough tree, use single-trunk form for street location*
'Sugar Thyme', 'Harvest Gold' Flowering Crabapple *These cultivars more vase-shaped and more resistant to foliar diseases than some*
'Princess Diana', 'Autumn Brilliance', 'Ballerina' Downy Serviceberry *White-flowers, autumn color in sun, small delicious berries loved by birds*

Medium-Sized Canopy Trees to 25'-50' in urban areas

- Katsuratree *Grows fast, beautiful leaves, provide adequate water to establish Not readily available in commerce. A treasure.*
'Green Mountain' or 'Fall Fiesta' Sugar Maple *Good cultivars of our native may do best inside walkway as they have some sensitivity to winter salt*
'Queen Elizabeth' Hedge Maple *Can be hard to find. Good for screening, Single-trunked form best for street tree use but will tolerate some "limbing-up"*
'Sterling' or 'Green Mountain' Silver Linden *Dark green leaves with silvery under-sides. Lindens may be attractive to bees for a short time when in bloom.*
American Hophornbeam *Tolerant of dry sites when established, interesting flowers and fruit*
'Autumn Blaze' Maple (Freeman maple) *Good central leader, grows fast, more drought tolerant than red maple*
'Autumn Flame', 'Red Sunset' Red Maple *Good autumn color, not drought tolerant, leaves may scorch among extensive paved areas*
Yellowwood *Good small shade tree, older bark smooth like beech, pretty leaves*

Medium to Large-Sized Canopy Trees to 40'- 60' in urban areas

- Swamp White Oak *One of the most easily-transplantable oaks. Tolerates wet soil yet drought tolerant when established*
Shumard Oak *Pyramidal when young. Will usually color in autumn*
'Sterling' or 'Green Mountain' Silver Linden *(see above notation)*
'Autumn Flame', 'Red Sunset' Red Maple *(see above notation)*
'Green Mountain' or 'Fall Fiesta' Sugar Maple *(see above notation)*
'Autumn Blaze' Maple (Freeman Maple) *(see above notation)*
'Urbanite' Green Ash *Grows fast and is much used for shade. Is prone to ash yellows disease and potentially prone to ash borer. 'Urbanite' is the only recommended cultivar.*
